## What Does "Numbers" Mean?



The word Numbers comes from the two times the people of Israel were counted in this book. God commanded Moses to take a census of the nation. This counted the men able to go to war and helped organize the tribes. But Numbers is about much more than counting people. It is the story of a people traveling through the wilderness, learning to trust God, failing many times, and seeing that God remains faithful.

## Who Wrote Numbers?

The human author of Numbers is traditionally believed to be Moses. Moses likely wrote Numbers around 1440 to 1400 BC during Israel's wilderness journey. God guided Moses by the Holy Spirit so these events and teachings were written truthfully.

## What Was Happening at the Time?

Israel had been rescued from slavery in Egypt. They had received God's Law at Mount Sinai. The tabernacle had been built, and God's presence was with them. Now it was time to travel toward the land God promised to Abraham and his descendants. But the journey became a time of testing.

- Would they trust God or complain?
- Would they obey or rebel?
- Would they believe His promises or fear their enemies?

Numbers tells that story.

## Main Theme of Numbers



Numbers shows that:

- God is faithful
- People often doubt and rebel
- Unbelief has consequences
- God guides His people
- God disciplines those He loves
- God keeps His promises despite human weakness



This book is about walking with God between deliverance and promise.

## Key Stories in Numbers



### ***1. The Twelve Spies***

Twelve men explored the Promised Land. Ten returned in fear. Two, Joshua and Caleb, trusted God. Because of unbelief, Israel wandered forty years in the wilderness.

### ***2. Manna and Complaining***

God provided food daily, yet the people still complained. This showed how quickly hearts forget blessings.

### ***3. Korah's Rebellion***

Some challenged Moses and Aaron's leadership. God judged the rebellion and defended the leaders He had appointed.

## Key Stories in Numbers



### ***4. Moses Strikes the Rock***

God told Moses to speak to the rock, but in anger he struck it. Because of disobedience, Moses would not enter the Promised Land.

### ***5. The Bronze Serpent***

When poisonous snakes came because of sin, God told Moses to lift up a bronze serpent. Those who looked in faith were healed.

### ***6. Balaam and the Donkey***

God used a donkey to stop the prophet Balaam and speak truth. This shows God can use anything He chooses.

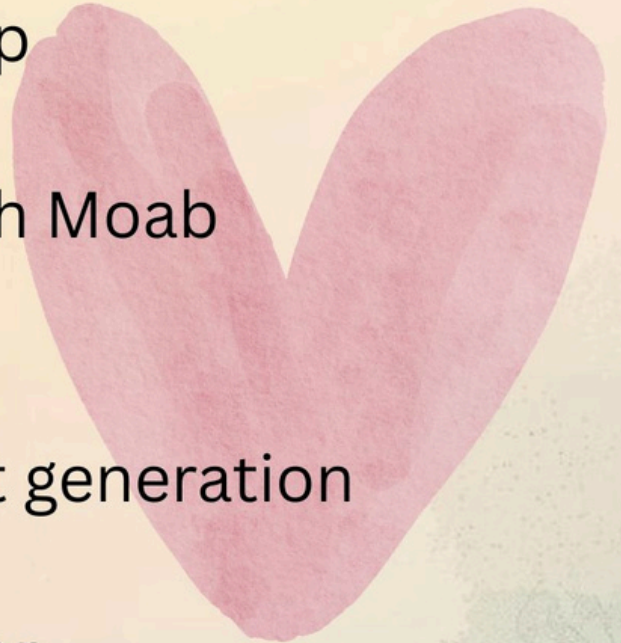

## How Numbers Points to Jesus



Numbers contains many pictures of Jesus Christ.

### ***1. The Bronze Serpent***

Those bitten by snakes were healed by looking in faith. Jesus said this pointed to Him being lifted up on the cross so people may have life.

### ***2. Manna in the Wilderness***

God fed Israel with bread from heaven. Jesus is the true Bread of Life.

### ***3. The Rock in the Wilderness***

God brought water from the rock.

Christ gives living water to thirsty souls.

### ***4. Faithful Leader***

Canaan pictured rest and inheritance.

Jesus brings eternal rest and a better inheritance.

## Important Lessons from Numbers

### **Unbelief Is Dangerous**

God had already proven His power, yet many still doubted.

### **Complaining Reveals the Heart**

Grumbling often shows forgotten gratitude.

### **God Is Patient**

Israel failed repeatedly, yet God continued to guide them.

### **Discipline Can Be Mercy**

God corrected His people to teach and protect them.

### **Faith Moves Forward**

Joshua and Caleb saw the same giants as everyone else, but they trusted God.

### **God Keeps His Word**

The first generation failed, but God still brought the next generation to the edge of the land.

## Why Numbers Still Matters Today

Numbers answers questions people still ask:

- Why does the journey with God sometimes feel hard?
- What happens when fear controls me?
- Can God still use people who fail?
- Why does God discipline His people?
- Will God stay faithful when I struggle?

Numbers says yes. Even in the wilderness, God remains present and faithful.
